Ross Lew is a Sr. Program Manager



with Highway Programs at the Orange County Transportation Authority. Mr. Lew joined OCTA ten years ago and is

responsible for overseeing the construction of the OC Streetcar and delivering freeway projects. In recent years Mr. Lew also delivered the construction of the OC Bridges Grade Separation Program that was budgeted at \$666.5 million. Lew is a graduate of the University of California, Irvine and has 32 years of management and project delivery experience in the transportation industry. He has been in the lead role on multiple complex projects in various phases of project implementation from planning through construction, working in partnership with many public agencies.

**Cleve Cleveland** is a transit professional with over 40 years of transit



experience that specializes in rail operations and maintenance and many successful streetcar startup projects.

Associate Director for The Transit Delivery Division for the District Department Transportation of (DDOT), Washington DC with the responsibility for planning, operation and maintaining safe and efficient movement of transit services through the District of Columbia's transportation system, including, the DC Circulator, DC Streetcar, Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority's (WMATA) Metrobus, Metrorail, and Metro Access, Amtrak, MARC and VRE.

Previously, Mr. Cleveland was the General Manager for the start-up and operations of the DC Streetcar Rail System located in Washington DC.

## \$6 million to be used to stabilize tracks from Orange **County to San Diego**

SAN DIEGO — A state transportation emergency has been declared over the need to re-stabilize the railroad track in San Clemente, which has forced the shutdown and suspended train service between San Diego and Orange counties along the Pacific Coast.

On Tuesday, Orange County Transportation Authority Board of Directors voted unanimously to declare an emergency need to stabilize the track, which clears the way for officials to work with a contractor to begin the work. The stabilization effort is anticipated to take 30-45 days and up to \$12 million.

The California Transportation Commission were able to secure \$6 million in emergency funding. The money is funded from the State Transportation Improvement Program for the track stabilization.

Nearby, a 218-unit complex is going up on 4th Street, promising a "new riff on downtown living" for rents likely above \$3,000 a month.

#### How California's Bullet Train Went Off the Rails

LOS ANGELES — Building the nation's first bullet train, which would connect Los Angeles and San Francisco, was always going to be a formidable technical challenge, pushing through the steep mountains and treacherous seismic faults of Southern California with a series of long tunnels and towering viaducts.

But the design for the nation's most ambitious infrastructure project was never based on the easiest or most direct route. Instead, the train's path out of Los Angeles was diverted across a second mountain range to the rapidly growing suburbs of the Mojave Desert — a route whose most salient advantage appeared to be that it ran through the district of a powerful Los Angeles county supervisor.

The dogleg through the desert was only one of several times over the years when the project fell victim to political forces that have added billions of dollars in costs and called into question whether the project can ever be finished.

## U.S. Department of Transportation Expands Its Financing Program to Help Even More Infrastructure **Projects Move Forward**

Transit and Transit-oriented Development join rural projects and select applicants for the Department's highly competitive INFRA/ Mega/Rural Grant programs to be eligible for low-cost, flexible financing for nearly half of project costs

WASHINGTON – U.S. Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg today announced that the U.S. Department of Transportation's Build America Bureau will offer low-cost and flexible financing for transit and Transit-oriented Development (TOD) projects at the maximum level authorized under law. USDOT's Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (TIFIA) program is designed to help project sponsors reduce costs and speed the delivery of infrastructure projects, which saves taxpayer dollars and improves transportation in communities. This new initiative, "TIFIA 49," authorizes borrowing up to 49% of eligible project costs for projects that meet certain eligibility requirements, helping more projects get off the ground. With few exceptions, TIFIA loans have historically been capped at 33% of eligible proiect costs.


