Dan Phu is the Environmental Programs Manager at the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA). He joined OCTA in 2007 as the Section Manager for the Project Development section to oversee the Measure M2 (M2) freeway program conceptual engineering/ planning studies.

He is currently leading two major environmental programs that are highly recognized in the industry: the M2 freeway Environmental Mitigation Program through the implementation of a Natural Community Conservation Plan/Habitat Conservation Plan and the M2 Environmental Cleanup Program, which administers competitive funds to local agencies for water quality improvement projects. His other functions at OCTA include: intergovernmental review of external documents, review of pending environmental legislation, peer review of environmental documents prepared by consultants, and conduct special studies on the state highway system.

Prior to OCTA, he was in the private sector at an engineering firm preparing environmental documents and project reports. His previous experiences included working at a transit agency in the San Gabriel Valley and the California Department of Transportation.

Dan has over twenty years of experience in the area of transit, environmental, transportation, programming, and project development. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Environmental Analysis and Design from the University of California, Irvine, and a Master of Science in Environmental Studies from the California State University, Fullerton. Dan has lived in the southern California area most of his life and enjoys spending time with his children.



ing 36-page letter to California high-speed rail officials, contra- ongoing efforts to combat human trafficking this month, fully dicting state claims that the line's construction pace is on target wrapping a bus with the message to join O.C. in fighting this and warning the project could miss a key 2022 federal deadline.

The letter, obtained by The Times, alleges that a multitude of problems have remained unresolved for years, including rapid turnover of state officials, continuing delays in obtaining land for the rail and the state's failure to secure agreements with outside parties, including utilities and freight railroads. The delays will result in idled work sites and layoffs of field workers, says the letter, by construction giant Tutor Perini.

As of mid-November, construction teams can not build on more than 500 parcels in the Fresno area because the California High Speed Rail Authority still lacks possession or proper documentation, according to the Jan. 4 letter. [Continue here]

The new Mission Viejo bridge aims to facilitate daily commuting

The Oso Parkway Bridge is officially open, officials said Jan. 13 as they touted the project as one that will improve traffic flow and increase safety.

The new bridge provides motorists a direct connection between Los Patronas Parkway and the State Route 241 toll road by passing under it, rather than having to stop at a busy intersection with signs.

The bridge offers six lanes of travel, with three in each direction. It also provides bike lanes and sidewalks to improve accessibility for walking and biking.

A new sidewalk on the south side of Oso Parkway provides greater access to Tesoro High School, making travel to and from school easier and safer for students and their families, authorities said.

The project is a successful result of a partnership between the Transportation Corridor Agencies, which funded the project, Orange County Public Works, which oversaw the construction, and Caltrans, which owns the 241 toll road. [Continue here]

State bullet train delays 'beyond comprehension,' OCTA 'Be The One' Campaign Helps Combat Human Trafficking

The OCTA campaign, which encourages riders and the public to 'Be The One to Help Out,' coincides with January as Human Trafficking Month.

> 'Human trafficking is a problem nationwide. Sadly, it harms some of our most vulnerable people right here in Orange County,' said OCTA Chairman Andrew Do, also the county's First District Supervisor. 'I'm proud of OCTA's efforts to bring public awareness to the problem and to train employees to get help for victims. The addition of a fully wrapped bus means that two 40foot buses will travel across Orange County wrapped in the Be The One (BT1) campaign ad, and buses throughout the county display interior cards with the National Human Trafficking Hotline: (888) 373-7888.(Continue here)

Metro Bus Drivers Overworked As Employees Call **Out Sick With COVID, Other Illnesses**

LOS ANGELES (CBSLA) - Hundreds of Los Angeles Metro bus drivers have contracted COVID since the outbreak began - and now a David Goldstein investigation has found some healthy drivers who say safety is being compromised because they're being overworked.

Nearly 35% of all Metro bus drivers are out sick with COVID or other illnesses. And the ones still on the job say they're being ordered to work six days a week plus overtime, and that could lead to accidents.

Drivers Goldstein spoke with say they've been working six days a week for the past few months to cover for other drivers out sick with COVID. And the long hours behind the wheel - and on the road with other motorists like you and me - are getting to them.

"You're like half asleep sometimes, you might miss the light or someone may jump in front of the bus and you gotta be reacting fast," one driver said. Metro says 800 bus operators are out right now due to COVID and unrelated illnesses. [Continue here]
