DYNAMIC INTERSECTION CLEARANCE, UTILIZING TECHNOLOGY TO

THINK "INSIDE THE BOX"

Program:

Mark Esposito will present Dynamic Intersection Clearance, utilizing technology to think "inside the box". Hartzog & Crabill, Inc. and the City of Tustin experimented with a new detection concept to address bicycle detection at signalized intersections. The detection concept was to look inside the intersection or "the box" and to dynamically extend both bicycles and vehicles through the intersection. Two distinct advantages are realized by using this technique including increased bicycle safety and improved intersection efficiency. The results are in and the City of Tustin is planning on moving beyond experimentation and moving to full deployment at several intersections.



Mark Esposito is a Senior Traffic Engineer with Hartzog & Crabill, Inc. (HCI) and has focused on providing traffic signal operations and design services to the Southern California region for the past 20 years. His in-depth knowledge of traffic signals and traffic signal systems has proven to be a valuable resource to the many agencies that HCI provides on-call traffic engineering services to. He



is currently the Project Manager for a number of traffic signal synchronization projects in Orange County, and has managed several signal synchronization projects over the years.


