


AB612 -- Automated enforcement systems.

Changes proposed by the California State Assembly to the vehicle code as a result of State Assembly Member Adrin Nazarian's proposal will require local agencies to adjust the minimum yellow at locations where automated enforcement technologies are deployed. Given the potential impacts to local operations as a result of this pending change, OCTEC urges those who oppose this action to reach out to your legislators in opposition. Action will be required by Tuesday, 6/25/13. Guidance for reaching out: Address letters to the chairman of the Senate Transportation & Housing Committee. Download the latest bill analysis from leginfo.legislature.ca.gov. The analyst assigned is Erin Riches. Send the letter to her. Contact info is http://stran.senate.ca.gov/ No e-mail addresses are provided for the Committee staff so it will have to be faxed. We need to hurry. The senate hearing is this Tuesday so send the letters to multiple places, like the Senators on the committee as well.

Section 21455.7 of the Vehicle Code is proposed to be amended to read:

21455.7.

- (a) At an intersection at which there is an automated enforcement system in operation, the minimum yellow light change interval for all movements shall be established at one second beyond the yellow light change intervals relating to designated approach speeds provided in the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, or its successor.
- (b) The minimum yellow light change intervals established pursuant to subdivision (a) are mandatory minimum yellow light change intervals. A citation issued by a law enforcement agency shall be dismissed if the local governmental agency or local authority has not established the yellow light change intervals in compliance with the requirements of this section.
- (c) A yellow light change interval may exceed the minimum interval established pursuant to subdivision (a).
