Our October Program:

Handling Beach Traffic – Improving Seasonal Traffic Flow on the Balboa Peninsula

The October 25, 2012 meeting will feature a presentation on "Handling Beach Traffic—Improving Seasonal Traffic Flow on the Balboa Peninsula" where Brad Sommers, of the City of Newport Beach, will detail the challenges and traffic engineering solutions deployed by the City to reach the goal of improving seasonal traffic flow on the Balboa Peninsula in recent years.

The Balboa Peninsula is home to approximately 12,000 residents and is a tourist destination for those looking to escape the summer heat by visiting the beach. This leads to a seasonal influx of up to 100,000 visitors on a nice day. During summer months and peak weekends, the peninsula is under great demand by vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic.

Access to the peninsula is limited to two arterials - Newport Boulevard and Balboa Boulevard, which converge at the "Mix-Master" intersection near the Newport Pier. This convergence handles the majority of the residential, beach and business traffic on the peninsula, proving essential to maintaining flow movement on the Peninsula.

To meet the City's goal, several engineering, traffic signal, and outreach/education strategies were deployed while coordinating with the project stakeholders.

The success of the project has been measured by improved traffic flow onto and off of the Peninsula, lead to better public understanding of Traffic Engineering, and has helped staff gain support in pursuit of future Traffic Engineering projects.

This project was a candidate for the 2011-2012 OCTEC Project of the Year award as it incorporated several aspects related to traffic engineering, including observation, planning, design, construction, modification, education, outreach, and coordination.

Brad Sommers, City of Newport Beach:

Born and raised in Orange County, Brad has over 20 years of Traffic Engineering Experience. Beginning counting cars shortly after getting his driver's license, Brad has worked part time for Weston Pringle and Associates, Austin-Foust Associates and the City of Newport Beach. Upon graduation from the University of California, Irvine, with a BS in Civil Engineering, Brad took a full time position with RBF Consulting and later moved back to the City of Newport Beach. Brad is a registered Professional Civil and Traffic Engineer within the State of California, has served on the OCTEC Board and currently works as a Senior Civil Engineer, overseeing the City's Traffic Operations Division and Traffic Management Center.


